 in any respect for account or mishap to competitors, animals, property or
 onlookers which may occur.
- 3. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, Kenilworth Hall Show and Recreation Ground Assn cannot accept any responsibility for any losses and/or damage or injury to or by any livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property whilst it is on the Kenilworth Showgrounds.
- 4. All QCAS affiliated Agricultural Societies have developed a comprehensive Agricultural Show Biosecurity Plan and all event organizers, competitors and spectators have a joint responsibility to ensure the successful implementation of a biosecurity plan.

- DOGS must be kept in a closed float, a vehicle, or on a short leash and must be suitably muzzled as to prevent it from being able to injure or bite any person or animal whilst on the Kenilworth Showgrounds. Dog owners take full responsibility.

The exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control comply with all requirements of the current Workplace Health and Safety Act, and the Affiliated Show Society holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the showgrounds.

SECTION 1 – HORSES

- 7. All ring competitors are required to pay gate entry. No admission is refunded
- 8. No entry will be received after commencement of each event and no ring shall be required to wait for a competitor who may be competing in another ring. Classes will not be held up for dual registered horses.
- 9. Any one horse can only compete once per event.
- 10. Stallions must not be left unattended. Any colt or stallion, 2 years and over shall be led with a stallion bit or chain and lead. No stallion is to compete in hacking events but may be ridden in breed events specified.
- 11. The show committee has the right to alter, bring forward, delay classes or cancel an event or section.
- 12. A Maiden is a horse or pony that has not won a first prize in a similar event at a Agricultural Show. A Maiden hack is a hack that has not won a hack class in competition at an affiliated show. After winning a maiden hack class this horse will be recognized as a Novice.
- 13. A Novice is a horse or pony that has never won a championship in a similar event at an Agricultural Show.
- 14. Horses may be entered in Hack classes or Hunter Hack classes but not in both.
- 15. All prize money to be collected on the day.
- 16. NO ELECTRIC FENCE, PANELS OR YARDS ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS DURING THE PERIOD OF THE SHOW. Safety officers are authorised to cut or remove same without notice.
- 17. Show Pony Hacks and Show Pony Hunter Hacks, 12.2 hands and under are to be ridden by a juvenile under 17 years of age; Show Pony Hacks and Show Hunter Pony Hacks over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by a juvenile or adult.
- 18. Any dispute must be lodged in writing to the committee secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the event along with a \$50 fee. This amount will be forfeited if such protest is considered frivolous by the disputes committee of three persons appointed by the Show Committee. The only protests which will be considered are those made by competitors in the relevant event.
- 19. Biosecurity Horse Health Declarations to be filled out with nominations and event participants are reminded that they have a responsibility to maintain good biosecurity practices and should not knowingly take sick horses to an event.
- 20. Work Place Health and Safety Rules and Regulations state Only competitors and officials are allowed in the ring while events are being run. Spectators, Parents, Guardians or Strappers are not permitted in the horse arena during judging.
- 21. Welfare of the horse is paramount. Any abuse of a horse in any manner will not be tolerated.
- 22. Exhibitors shall at all times behave in a proper and courteous manner to judges show officials and other exhibitors.

Class 27 Set Recipe

Jean Pearce's Orange Cake recipe

Ingredients

4 oz. Butter [approx. ½ cup]

4 oz. Sugar [approx. ½ cup]

1 tsp orange rind

2 eggs [well beaten]

2 oz. Cornflour [approx. ¼ cup]

4 oz. S.R. Flour [approx. ½ cup]

Pinch of salt

3 tblsp Orange juice

METHOD

Pre-heat oven to 375° F [190° C bake or 180° C fan-forced]. Grease well and line a bar tin. Cream together the butter, sugar and orange rind until light and fluffy. Gradually add well-beaten eggs. Sift cornflour, S.R. flour and salt together. Add dry ingredients alternately with orange juice to mixture. Pour into prepared pan. Bake for approx. 50 minutes or until cake is golden and skewer comes out clean when inserted. Cool in tin for approx. 10 minutes, and then turn out onto cake rake to cool completely.

Make plain icing of icing mix and water. For taste, add up to ¾ of left-over orange rind to icing; then spread on top of cake only.

Class 28 Set Recipe

Kenilworth Dairies - Super-Moist Coconut Lemon Cake

Ingredients

1 cup Caster Sugar

1 cup Macadamia oil

2 large eggs – at room temp.

Juice 1 lemon

1 cup Kenilworth Dairies Natural Yoghurt

Zest of 2 lemons

2 cups S.R. Flour

½ tsp salt

1 cup shredded coconut [plus extra for topping]

METHOD

1/ Pre-heat the oven to 200° C [180° fanforced]. Double-line a deep 20 cm round cake pan. [Springform pan accepted]

2/ Beat together sugar, oil, eggs and juice in a bowl.

3/ Add the yoghurt and rind to the bowl. Mix together.

4/ Add the flour, salt, and coconut to the mixture. Blend well.

5/ Pour batter into prepared tin.

6/ Bake for approx. 45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean when inserted.

7/ Turn out cake while still warm. Drizzle over with lemon icing. Decorate with extra coconut.

N.B. Un-iced cake suitable to freeze; can be stored in fridge in sealed container for up to one [1] week.




